

SPINK COUNTY DRAINAGE BOARD
September 27, 2011

The Spink County Drainage Board met on September 27, 2011, at 10:45 AM. Chairman Dave Albrecht called the meeting to order with Jeff Albrecht, Jerry Zerbel, Brian Johnson, Craig Johnson and Kimberly Markley, Drainage Administrator present. Visitors present were Pat Kramp, Richard Worlie, Jim Millar, Richard Rathjen, Dave Willis, Mike Sentell, Wayne Kramer, J. Steve Kingdon, Tim Anderson, Lenny Peterson, Russell Cole and Brad Letcher.

Brian Johnson made the motion to approve the agenda with the addition of Ryan Ball, seconded by Craig Johnson. Motion carried. Jerry Zerbel made the motion, seconded by Jeff Albrecht, to approve the minutes from September 6, 2011. Motion carried.

Markley presented a list of the drainage permits issued for the last two years.

Ryan Ball was present explain a proposed drainage project in Boetia Township to drain water along County Road 4 on the north side of sections 15, 14 & NW ¼ of 13 into the creek. It was the consensus of the board that a permit can be issued if all the signatures in the 1 ½ mile downstream are obtained.

The hearing for Peterson Farms to install drain tile in S ½ 32-114-62 and SW ¼ 33-114-62 with the outlet in SE ¼ 33-114-62 and drain into the James River in N1/2 3-113-62 started with Lenny Peterson explaining the proposed project. Wayne Kramer of SD DOT indicated that the culvert under State Hy 28 will handle the extra water. Richard Rathjen indicated he was not in favor of the project and presented the board with an elevation map, signatures of other land owners not in favor of the project and notes on case law. Jim Millar told the board that his company has run a tile plan for Peterson Farms and a 12' perforated tile would produced 4.5 gallons of water per second to the outlet, or 9 gallons per second of water if two lines were installed. This is all the water the elevations will allow. Mr. Millar also answered questions from the board. Tim Anderson expressed concerns about the level of nitrates that would be coming through the tile and is concerned with the ice building up along the township road in the spring. Mike Sentell the clerk of the Cornwall Township board thinks that Peterson Farms should install a larger culvert in the township road and build up the

township road. Russ Cole, also a Cornwall Township supervisor, is not in favor of the project and would like to withdraw his signature in favor of the project. Brian Johnson made a motion to table the hearing until next week to give members of the drainage board a chance to inspect the area of the project. Second by Jeff Albrecht, motion carried.

Richard Worlie and Pat Kramp explained concerns from the Benton Township Board about drainage work being done along 156th Street. They provided pictures of work that has been done. It was the consensus of the board that work should not be done without the appropriate permits.

Brian Johnson made a motion to adjourn as Spink County Drainage Board and reconvene as the Spink County Commissioners at 11:30 AM, seconded by Jerry Zerbel. Motion carried.
