

**SPINK COUNTY COMMISSION PROCEEDINGS
REDFIELD, SOUTH DAKOTA**

The Spink County Board of Commissioners met at 8:30 AM on Tuesday, August 3, 2010, at the Spink County Courthouse. Present were Commissioners Dave Albrecht, Jeff Albrecht, Brian Johnson, Craig Johnson and Jerry Zerbel. Chairman Dave Albrecht opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

ADOPT AGENDA

Motion was made by C. Johnson, seconded by B. Johnson, to adopt the agenda with the additions of a Quit Claim Deed on Masat's OL1 in NW1/4 9-117-63 (12.62A), Mario Hansen regarding use of the County Fairgrounds and Resolution #10-43. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

MINUTES APPROVED

Motion was made by B. Johnson, seconded by Zerbel, to approve the minutes of July 27, 2010. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

QUIT CLAIM DEED

Motion was made by C. Johnson, seconded by J. Albrecht, to approve Chairman Dave Albrecht's signing the Quit Claim Deed to Kevin Ellis, Kurt Ellis & Kerry Ellis, 2501 Janet Street, Rapid City, Pennington County, South Dakota, which is for the property sold to them at the County Tax Deed Auction on July 15, 2010. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION #10-41 TO RELEASE LIEN

A motion was made by C. Johnson, seconded by J. Albrecht, to table a decision to release County Lien totaling \$116,471.17 against Outlot 165' E&W by 133' N&S, Turton Town, Spink County, until such time as States Attorney has studied the matter and can advise. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

Auditor filed a Closing Statement provided by Grow Spink on Kiser's 1st N 165' of 6, Redfield City, Spink County. The statement shows that, after expenses from the sale of this property, \$2,632.53 was given to the County to apply toward the lien released in the following Resolution #10-43.

RESOLUTION TO RELEASE LIEN #10-43

WHEREAS, the records of the Spink County Register of Deeds and the Spink County Auditor show a County Assistance Lien against Virginia Denton in the amount of \$19,889.32, and

WHEREAS, such lien does appear against Kiser's 1st N 165' of 6, Redfield City, Spink County; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that such lien be released against the above described property, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such County Assistance Lien remains in effect against any other property of Virginia Denton.

PROCUREMENT POLICY OF SPINK COUNTY, SOUTH DAKOTA

RESOLUTION 10-42

WHEREAS it is customary and advisable for the counties of the State of South Dakota to set policy for acquiring equipment, materials, contracted labor and all other necessary things acquired for the proper operation of the county, and

WHEREAS counties operate under South Dakota Codified Laws, Rules and guidelines set forth and administrated by the South Dakota Department of Legislative Audit, and

WHEREAS the South Dakota Local Government Guide for the Acquisition, Disposals and Exchanges (Bid Booklet) is provided and updated by the South Dakota Department of Legislative Audit,

THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Board of Spink County Commissioners declares this 3rd day of August, 2010, that the County of Spink will use the South Dakota Local Government Guide for the Acquisition, Disposals and Exchanges as a guide for acquiring equipment, materials, contracted labor and all other necessary items, and

FURTHER be it resolved that Spink County will follow the South Dakota Codified Laws, Rules and guidelines that the South Dakota Local Government Guide for the Acquisition, Disposals and Exchanges is based upon.

Auditor and J. Albrecht reported that the Grass is Grass resolution adopted by the Spink County Commissioners and the James River Valley Commissioners Association has been sent to the South Dakota Association of County Commissioners. This resolution addresses the current method of assessing grasslands under the Productivity Formula. It will be reviewed by the SDACC Resolution Board and then be voted upon by the Commissioners at County Convention in September.

SD EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT STATE & LOCAL AGREEMENT

Dave Albrecht, Chairman, signed the SD EM State & Local Agreement for the 3rd Quarter of 2011.

Gary Markley has ordered leg extension for the table in the Commission Chambers and will also mount and finish them.

Commissioners then discussed group health insurance quotes and the pros and cons of flex spending accounts and health savings accounts.

Jeff Haessig, Highway Superintendent, gave an update of activities in that department. They want to complete chip sealing in Redfield City prior to the start of school, so plan to begin the week of August 16.

Haessig has kept in contact with the state regarding the Federal Aid money that Spink County qualified for last year.

Commissioner J. Albrecht inquired about heavy truck traffic during certain times of the year at large rural operations and inquired whether they could be asked to license those vehicles in Spink County.

Haessig and the Commissioners then made several changes to the 2011 requested highway budget.

All members voted aye. Motion carried.

Gordon Richard, VSO, stated that he has been training with Steve Oliva, Veterans Field Officer. When Kevin Bowen completes his training he will be Richard's immediate supervisor.

Richard will be meeting with local Vets' groups. There are currently 4 volunteers to drive the DAV van but, at times, not all are available. VSO will try to get more volunteers.

Because the computer he is using actually belongs to the Emergency Manager, Richard presented a quote for a new computer, operating system and printer for the sale price of \$618.00.

COMPUTER PURCHASE APPROVED

Motion was made by C. Johnson, seconded by Zerbel, to approve the VSO purchasing a Dell Inspiron 560, Windows 7 Operating System and 1320C Network Printer at the total sale price of \$618.00. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

Lannie Arthurs, Maintenance Supervisor, and Willie Gruenwald, Gruenwald Electric, discussed the County's backup generator and the transfer switch which was destroyed by lightning. Insurance will pay \$5,377.10 for the complete transfer switch replacement. Gruenwald reported that the generators will be installed outside for better air circulation. The unit will operate on natural gas and will have the capacity, also, to be wired as backup power to the elevator. Because of the necessity of having the generator and transfer switch up and running, they will be ordered by Cummins on an emergency basis so that installation can begin as soon as possible.

EMERGENCY GENERATOR AND TRANSFER SWITCH

Motion was made by C. Johnson, seconded by B. Johnson, to order a generator at \$13,563.42 (labor not included) from Cummins Central Power on an emergency basis because of the necessity of having backup power for the Sheriff Department, E911 Dispatch and refrigerated storage of expensive vaccines in the County Health Department. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

Norb Barrie, Turton, attended the meeting to discuss Resolution #10-41, which the Commissioners had tabled at the beginning of the meeting.

PLANNING AND ZONING

At 10:00 AM motion was made by J. Albrecht, seconded by C. Johnson, to recess as a Board of County Commissioners and convene as a Planning and Zoning Board with Jessica Avery, Planning and Zoning Administrator, present. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

At 10:50 AM the Spink County Board of Commissioners reconvened after having adjourned as a County Planning and Zoning Board and as a Drainage Board.

Vic Fischbach, States Attorney, discussed Dakota Disk with the Commission. The annual cost is \$600 per year or \$750 with the States Attorney added. This would require that a computer be installed in the Law Library. Currently, the County pays over \$6,500 per year to keep the Law Library volumes up to date.

Commissioners also discussed with Fischbach Resolution #10-41 to release lien against OL 165' E&W by 133' N&S in OL F and against OL F beg 165' E of SW cor 50' E&W 133' N&S, Turton Town. Auditor will make copies of the Resolution and pertinent information for Fischbach.

Mario Hansen met with the Commissioners to ask whether the Redfield Ringneck Shriners could again hold their Ranch Rodeo at the Fairgrounds. Commissioners stated that, because Mark Rosenberg, Extension Educator, has approved, they are in agreement as well. Certificate of Insurance is required of any party using the Fairgrounds.

Rich Jankord, Youth at Risk, gave a history of how the organization came about and explained services they provide for youth who are generally referred by a school guidance counselor. He stated that part of his job is in arranging payment by insurance or Medicaid. However, they have been able to operate within the \$4,050 annual budget contributed by the county for things not covered by a third party provider.

EXPENSE REQUEST

Motion was made by J. Albrecht, seconded by C. Johnson, to approve the following expense request:

Larry Tebben, Emergency Manager, to Emergency Management Conference, Hot Springs, Sept. 14-16, 2010;

All members voted aye. Motion carried.

2011 PROVISIONAL BUDGET ADOPTED

Motion was made by C. Johnson, seconded by B. Johnson to adopt the 2011 Provisional Budget as filed. The first hearing on the Budget will be held on September 7, 2010, with the second hearing and final adoption on September 28, 2010. All members voted aye. Motion carried.
