

**SPINK COUNTY COMMISSION PROCEEDINGS
REDFIELD, SOUTH DAKOTA**

The Spink County Board of Commissioners met at 8:30 AM on Tuesday, March 29, 2011, at the Spink County Courthouse. Present were Commissioners Dave Albrecht, Jeff Albrecht, Brian Johnson, Craig Johnson and Jerry Zerbel. Chairman Dave Albrecht opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

ADOPT AGENDA

Motion was made by B. Johnson, seconded by C. Johnson, to adopt the agenda with the additions of Sheriff Kevin Schurch, Larry Tebben, EM, and Gordon Richard, VSO. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

MINUTES APPROVED

Motion was made by J. Albrecht, seconded by C. Johnson, to approve the minutes of March 15, 2011. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

GRANT AGREEMENT FOR COOPERATIVE ACTION

Motion by C. Johnson, second by Zerbel, to approve the 50/50 matching Grant Agreement for Cooperative Action pertaining to purchasing weed spray chemical. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

The above weed spray chemical expense is an annual budgeted item.

APPLICATION FOR PERMITS TO LAND AIRCRAFT ON SPINK COUNTY HIGHWAYS

Motion was made by J. Albrecht, seconded by B. Johnson, to approve the Applications for Permits to Land Aircraft on Spink County Highways which were received from Doland Aerial Spraying, Doland, and Wilbur-Ellis Air LLC, Huron. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

REPAYMENT OF TAXES AGREEMENTS

Kim Markley, Director of Equalization, appeared at the meeting for a discussion regarding the county's responsibility when bridges or culverts are to be placed on township roads. Vic Fischbach, States Attorney, had filed a memo, including SDCL 31-14-27, with the Commission addressing the issue. Markley will send a letter to the three township residents who attended the March 15, 2011 meeting informing them of what the law advises.

AFFIDAVIT OF FAILURE TO MAINTAIN MAIL ROUTE

Commissioners also discussed an affidavit of failure to maintain a mail route which was received from two Spring Township residents. Jeff Haessig, Highway Superintendent, was present for the discussion and reported that he had been contacted by the Spring Township Chairman who requested that the county occasionally be hired to push snow from certain township roads. Auditor was asked to notify the residents of the agreed upon arrangement.

HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT

Jeff Haessig, Highway Superintendent, filed the April fuel quotes and gave an update of flooded areas, expected flooding and bridge damage south of Doland.

EMERGENCY MANAGER

Larry Tebben, Emergency Manager, discussed flood issues with the Commissioners and reported that next Wednesday the LEPC will meet regarding tornado disaster response. Tebben requested that the Commission declare Spink County a disaster due to flooding beginning March 19, 2011.

RESOLUTION FOR THE DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY DISASTER (#11-17)

Whereas, Spink County, South Dakota, has suffered severe damage brought on by the 2011 Spring flood beginning March 19, 2011 and,

Whereas, Spink County has committed all available resources and taken all possible actions within the jurisdictional boundaries to combat and to alleviate the emergency/disaster, local resources are not adequate to cope with the situation.

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Spink County Board of Commissioners at their regular meeting held on March 29, 2011, it is hereby requested that the Governor declare an emergency/disaster to exist in the County of Spink.

Tebben also requested that, in order to complete the Chapter 17-13 Flood Plain Ordinance process, the county pass a resolution for the enforcement of flood insurance program regulations.

RESOLUTION #11-16 FOR THE ENFORCEMENT OF SECTION 60.3 NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM REGULATIONS

WHEREAS certain areas of Spink County are subject to periodic flooding, mudslide (i.e. mudflow), or flood-related erosion, causing serious damages to properties within these areas; and

WHEREAS relief is available in the form of federally subsidized flood insurance as authorized by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968; and

Spink County Commission – March 29, 2011

WHEREAS it is the intent of this Board of Spink County Commissioners to require the recognition and evaluation of flood, mudslide (i.e. mudflow), or flood-related erosion hazards in all official actions relating to land use in areas having these hazards; and

WHEREAS this body has the legal authority to adopt land use and control measures to reduce future flood losses pursuant to 17.13 Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this Board of Spink County Commissioners hereby:

- 1) Assures the Federal Emergency Management Agency that it will enact, as necessary, and maintain in force in those areas having flood, mudslide (i.e., mudflow), or flood-related erosion hazards, adequate land use and control measures with effective enforcement provisions consistent with the criteria set forth in Section 60.3 of the National Flood Insurance Program Regulations; and
- 2) Vests Spink County Equalization with the responsibility, authority, and means to:
 - i) Assist the Administrator, at his request, in his delineation of the limits of the area having special flood, mudslide (i.e., mudflow), or flood-related erosion areas.
 - ii) Provide such information as the Administrator may request concerning present uses and occupancy of the floodplain, mudslide (i.e., mudflow), or flood-related erosion areas.
 - iii) Cooperate with Federal, State, and local agencies and private firms that undertake to study, survey, map, and identify floodplain, mudslide (i.e., mudflow), or flood-related erosion areas, and cooperate with neighboring communities with respect to management of adjoining floodplain, mudslide (i.e., mudflow), or flood-related erosion areas in order to prevent aggravation of existing hazards.
 - iv) Submit on the anniversary date of the community's initial eligibility an annual report to the Administrator on the progress made during the past year within the community in the development and implementation of floodplain management measures.
 - v) Upon occurrence, notify the Administrator in writing whenever the boundaries of the community have been modified by annexation or the community has otherwise assumed or no longer has authority to adopt and enforce floodplain management regulations for a particular area. In order that all Flood Hazard Boundary Maps and Flood Insurance Rate Maps accurately represent the community's boundaries, include within such notification a copy of a map of the community suitable for reproduction, clearly delineating the new corporate limits or new area for which the community has assumed or relinquished floodplain management regulatory authority.
- 3) Appoints the Spink County Equalization Office to maintain for public inspection and to furnish upon request, for the determination of applicable flood insurance risk premium rates within all areas having special flood hazards identified on a Flood Hazard Boundary Map or Flood Insurance Rate Map, any certificates of flood proofing and information on the elevation (in relation to mean sea level) of the level of the lowest floor (including basement) of all new or substantially improved structures, and whether or not such structures contain a basement, and if the structure has been flood proofed, the elevation (in relation to mean sea level) to which the structure was flood proofed.
- 4) Agrees to take such other official action as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of the program.
