

**SPINK COUNTY COMMISSION PROCEEDINGS  
REDFIELD, SOUTH DAKOTA**

The Spink County Board of Commissioners met at 8:30 AM on Tuesday, September 10, 2013, at the Spink County Courthouse. Present were Commissioners Dave Albrecht, Jeff Albrecht, Craig Johnson, Pat Kramp and Cindy Schultz. Chairman Dave Albrecht opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

**ADOPT AGENDA**

Motion was made by Kramp, seconded by Johnson, to adopt the agenda. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

**MINUTES APPROVED**

Motion was made by J. Albrecht, seconded by Schultz, to approve the minutes of the September 3, 2013 Commission meeting. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

**BURN BAN**

Discussion was held on implementing a burn ban. Motion was made by Kramp, seconded by Schultz, to place a burn ban into effect immediately, requiring individuals to get the permission of the local fire chief and contact the Sheriff's Department for any controlled burns. Roll call vote: Johnson - aye; Kramp - aye; J. Albrecht – nay; Schultz – aye; D. Albrecht – nay. Motion carried.

**STATES ATTORNEY**

Vic Fischbach, States Attorney, gave an update of activities and addressed some drainage questions.

**HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT**

Jeff Haessig, Highway Superintendent, gave an update of activities and requested to purchase a new motor grader off Spink County's current bid.

**MOTOR GRADER**

Motion was made by J. Albrecht, seconded by Johnson, to purchase a 2013 or newer motor grader off the current bid with Butler Machinery Co., Aberdeen, for \$258,240 with a buy back guarantee of \$150,000 and guaranteed cost of ownership of \$134,184. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

**MAINTENANCE SUPERVISOR**

Mike Siebrecht, Maintenance Supervisor, and Leon Vanderesch, Leon's Cleaning Service, discussed a stone floor protection system with a quoted price of \$4,995 for all 3 floors of the courthouse. Consideration to adjust the 2014 budget to accommodate the cost will be given at the September 24<sup>th</sup> meeting.

**SHERIFF**

Kevin Schurch, Sheriff, gave an update of activities, filed his monthly report and filed a request for leave without pay for an employee. Motion was made by Johnson, seconded by Kramp, to approve the request for leave without pay. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

**VETERAN SERVICE OFFICER**

Gordon Richard, Veteran Service Officer, invited the Commissioners to Spink County's POW/MIA Recognition Day observance September 20th.

**PLANNING & ZONING**

At 9:56 AM a motion was made by Kramp, seconded by Schultz, to recess as a Board of County Commissioners and convene as a Planning & Zoning Board. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

At 10:50 AM the Board of Spink County Commissioners reconvened following adjournment as a Drainage Board.

**REGISTER OF DEEDS**

Sharon Jungwirth, Register of Deeds, requested a contingency transfer to the Modernization and Preservation Relief Fund for the rebinding of books and asked that the 2014 Budget for the Modernization and Preservation Relief Fund be increased by \$4,000 for the rebinding of books, consideration of this will be given at the September 24<sup>th</sup> meeting.

Theresa Hodges, Auditor, discussed the need for a contingency transfer to the Dissolved Township Fund for materials and labor for graveling, culvert replacement, blading and mowing.

**CONTINGENCY TRANSFER**

Motion was made by Johnson, seconded by J. Albrecht, to approve the following contingency budget transfers:

**WELFARE DIRECTOR**

Ann Bottum, Welfare Director, presented a request for preapproval of services for client #211 and bills for client #162: Community Memorial Hospital, \$663.98; Avera St. Luke’s, \$2233.30; Avera Heart Hospital, \$6902.01; AMG Radiology, \$7.74; North Central Heart, \$1586.78; Anesthesiology Assoc., \$334.80; Physician Lab, LTD, \$38.33; Midwestern Endocrinology, \$180.27; Avera Medical Group Cardiovascular, \$70.86; Avera Internal Medicine Specialists, \$57.63; Avera Medical Group Cardiovascular, \$62.47; Avera St. Luke’s, \$885.83; AMG Radiology, \$262.11; Community Memorial Hospital, \$2185.40.

Motion was made by Kramp, seconded by Schultz, to pre-approve, as per SDCL 28-13-33, the request by client #211 for wound vac dressing changes 2 times per week beginning 9/10 through 10/10/13, pending the denial of other resources, noting the client’s ability to pay \$7306.22. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Schultz, seconded by Kramp, to deny payment of bills: Avera Medical Group Cardiovascular, \$62.47; Avera St. Luke’s, \$885.83; AMG Radiology, \$262.11; Community Memorial Hospital, \$2185.40, due to lack of prior approval(SDCL 28-13-33) & timely filing of notice of hospitalization(SDCL 28-13-34.1). Roll call vote: Johnson - nay; Kramp - aye; J. Albrecht – aye; Schultz – aye; D. Albrecht – aye. Motion carried.

**HEALTH INSURANCE**

Dave Willis, BW Insurance, discussed Wellmark BCBS health insurance premium lock-in and the effective date waiting period for new hires. The Commissioners have chosen not to lock-in at this time. Motion was made by Johnson, seconded by Kramp, to select waiting period “Effective date is 1<sup>st</sup> of month following date of eligibility.” All members voted aye. Motion carried.

Willis, also discussed the County’s last liability insurance claim, with the Commissioners agreeing to not continue with the claim.

**2014 BUDGET**

Theresa Hodges, Auditor, requested that the Auditor, Election and Poor Relief 2014 budgets be adjusted to reflect the original requested amounts. Discussion was held on the 2014 budget with consideration for any adjustments to be given at the September 24<sup>th</sup> meeting.
