Motion was made by J. Albrecht, seconded by Kramp, to adopt the agenda. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Kramp, seconded by Johnson, to approve the minutes of the March 15, 2016 Commission meeting. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

At 9:41 AM, time set by public notice was 9:30 AM, a hearing was held to consider an appeal of the denial by the Spink County Planning & Zoning Board of Terry Marshall's variance request for a variance to plant trees closer than the current ordinance, in the parcel described as SW ¼ less 20 Acres 34-114-64, with Kim Markley, Director of Equalization, Tim Reinbold, Planning & Zoning Director, and Terry & Dawn Marshall, applicants, present. Terry and Dawn Marshall spoke in favor of the variance. Motion was made by Schultz, seconded by Kramp, to grant a 15 foot variance. Roll Call Vote: Schultz: aye; J. Albrecht: nay; Kramp: aye; Johnson: nay; D. Albrecht: nay. Motion failed. Motion was made by Johnson, seconded by J. Albrecht, to deny the appeal for variance. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

### DIRECTOR OF EQUALIZATION

The Commissioners met with Kim Markley, Director of Equalization, to hold their annual conference with the Director, SDCL 10-3-14, and stated they are satisfied with her job performance. Also filed was a copy of the Sales and Compliance Audit Report of the Director of Equalization office that was conducted by the Department of Revenue. Motion was made by Johnson, seconded by Kramp, to waive the \$25 fee for an ULTRA program data dump for the 10 municipalities within Spink County and to refund the City of Redfield the \$25 already paid. All members voted aye. Motion carried.
