

**SPINK COUNTY COMMISSION PROCEEDINGS  
REDFIELD, SOUTH DAKOTA**

The Spink County Board of Commissioners met at 8:30 AM on Tuesday, January 10, 2023, at the Spink County Courthouse. Present were Commissioners Dave Albrecht, Brian Johnson, Kevin Siebrecht and Suzanne Smith. Commissioner Brett Knox joined the meeting at 8:35 AM. Theresa Hodges, Auditor, acting as Chairman Pro-Tem, opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

**ADOPT AGENDA**

Motion was made by Johnson, seconded by Albrecht, to adopt the agenda. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

**MINUTES APPROVED**

Motion was made by Albrecht, seconded by Johnson, to approve the minutes of the December 29, 2022 Commission meeting. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

**CHAIRMAN NOMINATIONS**

Hodges called for 2023 Spink County Commission Chairman nominations pursuant to SDCL 7-8-15.

Motion by Albrecht to nominate Suzanne Smith for 2023 Chair and that nominations cease; seconded by Siebrecht. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

Chair Smith then called for nominations for Vice Chairman. Motion by Albrecht to nominate Brian Johnson for 2023 Vice Chairman and that nominations cease; seconded by Siebrecht. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

**PUBLIC COMMENT**

Dana Siefkes-Lewis and Aaron Eldredge, Summit Carbon Solutions gave an update and answered questions.

**SHERIFF**

Frank Krumm, Sheriff, gave an update of activities, filed a yearly activity report, a prisoner housing agreement, and a copy of the Soliant renewal for 3/6/2023, and requested to purchase a vehicle off state bid.

**VEHICLE BID**

Motion was made by Johnson, seconded by Knox, to approve purchasing a Dodge Durango pursuit rated vehicle from Wegner Auto, Pierre, SD off the State of South Dakota bid of \$40,333.00 base price plus \$1,515.00 for the additional options of: spotlight, engine block heater and full size spare. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

**PRISONER HOUSING AGREEMENT**

Motion was made by Albrecht, seconded by Knox, to approve the Beadle County Prisoner Housing Agreement with a term of January 1, 2023, to December 31, 2023, for \$95.00 per adult prisoner day. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

**APPOINTMENT OF HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT**

Motion was made by Albrecht, seconded by Siebrecht, to reappoint Jeff Haessig as Highway Superintendent for an additional two years, as per SDCL 31-11-1, beginning January 1, 2023. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

**HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT**

Jeff Haessig, Highway Superintendent, requested a personnel pay step increase and authorization to contract for fuel.

**PERSONNEL**

Motion was made by Johnson, seconded by Johnson, seconded by Knox, to approve the pay step increase of Ann Bottum, part-time Highway/Weed Secretary, to \$19.67/hr effective 12/26/22. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

**CONTRACT FUEL**

Motion was made by Knox, seconded by Johnson, to approve Jeff Haessig, Highway Superintendent, to contract up to 40,000 gallons of fuel in the next six months. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

**RURAL ACCESS INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING**

Jeff Haessig, Highway Superintendent, reviewed with the board applications that were filed for the Rural Access Infrastructure Grant. 4 townships filed a total of 5 applications. Benton Township withdrew their application after the application deadline and will not be considered in this round of grant awards.

Motion was made by Albrecht, seconded by Johnson, to table until the January 24, 2023 meeting Conde and Olean Townships' applications due to lack of second quote filed on work to be completed. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Johnson, seconded by Knox, to approve Union Townships' two applications, for replacement of: culvert #5 58-3194-4027, total project cost \$16,920.00, 80% grant award \$13,536.00; culvert #3 58-3168-4127, total project cost \$34,770.00, 80% grant award \$27,816.00. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

**NECOG**

Eric Senger and Lesleann Palmer, NECOG, reviewed the 2022 Performance Report and gave an update on services their organization provides.

**TREASURER/PERSONNEL**

Amy Michlitsch, Treasurer, requested approval for overtime for staff to process tax bills, due to staff covering an extended leave in another department. Motion was made by Knox, seconded by Johnson, to approve up to 8 hours of overtime for staff to process tax bills. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

**ABATEMENT**

Tracey Millar, Director of Equalization, and Amy Michlitsch, Treasurer, filed an application for abatement of property taxes. Motion was made by Johnson, seconded by Knox, to approve the abatement of 2021 taxes payable in 2022 in the of \$751.84 bill #4340, on the property described as Leinen's OL 1 (LS-MH) due to the mobile home being removed prior to November 1, 2020, therefore should have been removed from the 2021 assessment rolls. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

**REZONING HEARING**

At 9:45 AM time set by public notice, a hearing was held to consider an application to rezone a property, with no one present for or against the application. The application was read aloud, Applicant: Christopher Drayer Legal: Original B 8 W 1/2 of Lot 15, Lots 16 & 17, Doland City; and Lot 1 of Wurtz Replat of a portion of Lot 15, Doland City; Reason for Petition to Rezone: Reclassify from Commercial to Residential. A second reading will be held January 24, 2023 at 9:45 AM.

**RESOLUTION DESIGNATING SPINK COUNTY BANK DEPOSITORIES FOR 2023 (#23-1)**

WHEREAS, the Spink County Board of Commissioners is to designate the bank depositories for all County funds,

BE IT RESOLVED that the following financial banking systems within Spink County be named as bank depositories for county funds:

- American Bank & Trust, Mellette

- And Dakotaland Federal Credit Union, Redfield;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the following banking system within Spink County is the active depository for deposits and withdrawals of daily receipts of cash, checks, drafts and other cash items:

**RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING COMPENSATION FOR ELECTION BOARDS (#23-2)**

WHEREAS, annually it is the duty of the Spink County Board of Commissioners to establish an hourly rate to be paid to Superintendent and Deputies of each election and additional canvassing board, if appointed, in accordance with SDCL 12-15-11 and any amendments thereto, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Spink County Board of Commissioners, that the person delivering the poll books and ballot boxes to the proper authority to and from the polling place shall receive the current County rate for mileage for miles necessarily traveled in going to and returning from making such delivery, and

BE IT RESOLVED that the Superintendent and Deputies who attend the Election School shall receive \$20.00 per diem in accordance with SDCL 12-15-7, \$200 per diem for Election day and the current County rate for mileage for miles necessarily traveled in going to and returning from such school, and

BE IT RESOLVED that the Resolution Board and Absentee Board shall receive a minimum of \$50.00 or \$15.00 per hour if their time exceeds 3.5 hours, and

BE IT RESOLVED that aids providing assistance at the polling places shall receive \$11.00 per hour, and

BE RESOLVED that the polling places shall receive compensation of \$75.00 each for the Primary and General Elections.

**RESOLUTION SETTING PER DIEM FOR BOARDS (#23-3)**

WHEREAS, the Spink County Board of Commissioners is to set a per diem for the boards, such as County Fair, 4-H, E-911, and any other board pertaining to the County,

BE IT RESOLVED that each member of the boards shall receive the amount of \$35.00 per diem for each and every meeting attended, plus the current County rate per mile to and from each meeting, and

BE IT RESOLVED that when a telephone conference call is made instead of a meeting each Board member shall receive \$5.00 if contacted on telephone conference call, and

BE IT RESOLVED that when a Board member attends a multi-day state annual conference in accordance with grant requirements, the Board member shall receive the amount of \$100.00 per diem, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Commissioner who is a member of such board shall receive mileage at the County rate, but Commissioner's membership on such Board is part of the duties as a County Commissioner.

**RESOLUTION TO DESIGNATE PLACE TO HOLD CHATTEL MORTGAGE SALES (#23-4)**

WHEREAS, it is the duty of the Spink County Board of Commissioners to designate the place at which Chattel Mortgage sales may be held in Spink County,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Spink County Board of Commissioners that the Court House in the City of Redfield is hereby designated as the place for holding Chattel Mortgage sales in Spink County.

**RESOLUTION DESIGNATING OFFICIAL COUNTY NEWSPAPERS - SDCL 7-18-3 (#23-5)**

WHEREAS, it is the duty of the Spink County Board of Commissioners to designate and appoint the Spink County Official Newspapers,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Spink County Commissioners that The Redfield Press, Redfield, South Dakota, be designated and appointed the Official Legal Newspaper for Spink County, South Dakota, for the year 2023, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that such proceedings shall be published as soon after any meeting as practicable.

**SPINK COUNTY WEIGHT LIMIT ENFORCEMENT RESOLUTION (#23-6)**

WHEREAS, seasonal climatic changes can be detrimental to our highways, and

WHEREAS, the Spink County Board of Commissioners desires to protect existing Spink County highways, ultimately saving tax dollars, and

WHEREAS, the Spink County Board of Commissioners desires the enforcement of weight limitation of Spink County roads as set forth and posted by the Spink County Highway Superintendent, and

WHEREAS, the limits on Spink County Highways shall be set at six (6) ton per axle and the speed limit shall be set at 40 miles per hour on all asphalt surface roads, plus six miles of gravel from Day County west to State Highway 37, during the spring thaw period and when limit signs are in place,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the South Dakota Highway Patrol be and hereby is authorized and requested to enforce weight limitations on Spink County roads.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the penalty for the violation of load restrictions shall be as set forth in SDCL 32-22-55.

**RESOLUTION SETTING BURIAL FEES (#23-7)**

WHEREAS, it is the duty of the Spink County Board of Commissioners to establish an amount to be paid for services for County Burial in accordance with SDCL 28-17-4 and any amendments thereof,

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that for a standard sized casket and the burial services the sum of \$2500.00 shall be allowed plus, \$700 for a vault if used, the invoice amount for the opening and closing of the grave, the state rate for mileage, and a flat fee of \$2500.00 for cremations.

**RESOLUTION SETTING NUMBER OF DEPUTIES AND CLERKS (#23-8)**

WHEREAS, law requires the Board of Commissioners to fix the number of deputies and clerks that shall be employed in the offices of the County Treasurer, Auditor, Coroner and Register of Deeds, the time of employment and the compensation which they shall receive,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Spink County Board of Commissioners, in session this 10th day of January 2023, that in accordance with SDCL 7-7-20 deputies and clerks may be employed in these offices as follows:

- Treasurer – one full-time deputy and one permanent part-time deputy;
- Auditor – two full-time deputies;
- Coroner – deputies as needed;
- Register of Deeds – one part-time deputy.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a part-time clerk may be employed at times in any of the offices, as deemed necessary by the elected officer. Salaries are to be as set by this Board.

Motion was made by Knox, seconded by Siebrecht, to approve and adopt the above eight resolutions. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.
